Guest: Scott Maxwell, Principal of Kyrene Middle School

- Scott's Background: 3 years as Principal at KMS, previously Director of Effectiveness at Kyrene, social studies teacher, principal at a charter school, background in school improvement & change management
- KMS is an International Baccalaureate school, with students taking 7 classes as opposed to 6. World language is required, and options include Mandarin, Spanish (3 levels), and ASL. They are a Dual language school.
- KMS offers a variety of electives and requires 1 in design (STEM, visual design, etc.), 1 in P.E. (can get credit from sports), and 1 in fine arts (mariachi, theater, orchestra, choir, band, etc.)
- Prep program advanced learner program, grades 6-8, including advanced math & gifted. New structure breaks out students by grade, includes interactive field trips, trips to ASU/Barret Honors College, GCU, U of A
- Making capital improvements in "bright spots", including courtyard, murals, new scoreboard, and banners
- Contact Scott for any questions on KMS or to schedule a tour, as you consider middle school options

Principal's Report: Mrs. Romero

- Thank you from the teachers for the Curriculum Lunch!
- K-2 playground shade structure has been removed for safety and the kids can now use the playground
- Student of the Month will begin towards the end of September, and will be held outside under blue ramada.
- Student Council for grades 3-5 coming up info will come home
- Step it up Assembly scheduled for Monday 9/13
 - With current Safety Mitigation Level, can have 2 grade levels in the cafeteria at a time

- Kyrene COVID Mitigation Strategies & Policy Clarification: Main Differences:
 - Any positive test class will receive exposure letter, plus any small groups where they interact with others
 - We are getting spare masks through the Kyrene warehouse, but any donations would be accepted and used
 - Mitigation Strategy Main Differences between levels:
 - Level 1 Substantial Transmission (County)
 - Level 2 (CURRENT STATE) High Transmission (County) reconfigured assemblies in person
 - Level 3 High Transmission (County) plus 2% or higher case count, of total # of students, for 2 weeks. This translates to 9-10 active cases for 2 weeks in a row. It means we will get further direction on going to Level 4, no volunteers, virtual assemblies, and kids go straight inside instead of lining up to start the day. Limited Exposure Schedule means we will keep our 2 entrances, might separate classes for dismissal, and classes would stay together in zones at recess. Can still do compact math & reading intervention groups. Cafeteria would be 2 classes at a time in the room... 3rd class would go in another room and rotate. Only go to Level 4 if this holds for >2 weeks.
 - Level 4 would mean student groups need to be addressed... if the impact is mostly to specific grades, classes, or the whole school, those groups would need to go online for a period of time
 - Level 5 all school online, mandated by the state or county
