- KMS is an international baccalaureate school: means students get a well-rounded education at KMS. Every student is required to take a world language (Spanish, sign language and mandarin). Students take 5 core classes and electives (band, choir, drama, visual arts, mariachi, visual arts, multimedia, stem lab, audio engineering). Dual language program: cohort of students coming from Norte. GATE and PREP program - accelerated cohort- please fill out interest form if your student is gifted. Experienced, senior teachers in GATE/PREP program. Boys to Men program: nonprofit that provides group counselling sessions and group support after school to help young men make better decisions. Also employing a method for young women to meet with counsellors and support better decision-making.

- Enrollment process: students within boundaries are automatically eligible for enrollment; others who live outside of the boundaries will be open enrollment and should apply accordingly. Current enrollment: 920 students-- average class sizes are 27.

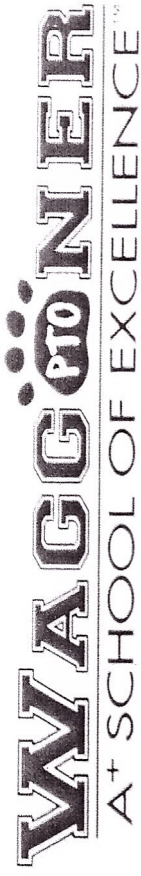
3. January Minutes stand approved.
